January 3, 1921 - December 11, 2012

Eva M. Stufflebeam passed away Tuesday, Dec. 11, 2012, at Timberview Nursing home in Albany. She was 91.

Eva was born Jan. 3, 1921, in Vancouver, Wash., to Joseph and Margaret (Crawford) Jobst. She married Webster Falk in 1941 in Vancouver. They then moved to Suver, where they worked on their family farm. In 1960, Webster unexpectedly passed away, leaving Eva to tend to the farm and their three children.
