Leland Earl Montgomery passed away in Albany. He was 88. Leland lived in Corvallis for 39 years, and was retired, having been previously employed by Neptune Microfloc.

Leland was born in Sheridan, Wyo., to Robert and Rose Montgomery. Leland served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II. He was a Pearl Harbor survivor. Leland was serving at Hickam Field in Pearl Harbor when the Japanese attacked. He also served in the South Pacific islands. Leland served in the Army Air Corps for five years before returning home in 1945 to Kellogg, Idaho, where he met and married his sweetheart, Amelia Ulrich of St. John, Wash.

Over the years, Leland enjoyed the hobby of model railroads. He also enjoyed owning recreational vehicles and visiting railroads to enjoy the sights of trains going down the tracks. Leland knew just about everything regarding trains and railroads.

One of Leland's favorite things to do was eating dinner out at local restaurants.

Leland was preceded in death by his second wife, Ilaine Scott Montgomery, in 2001.
