Lois Annette (Snyder) Ware, 72, passed away April 4, 2019, after a sudden diagnosis and brief affliction with pancreatic cancer.

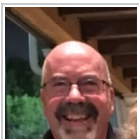

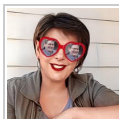
