Marion Rigney Hardy passed away in Corvallis, Oregon, after a challenging battle with cardiovascular disease on March 11, 2015.

Marion was born on December 30, 1935 in El Paso, Texas, to John and Verlie Hardy, and grew up in San Jose, California. He is survived by his son and daughter-in-law, Douglas and Janice Hardy of Albany, Oregon, along with his grandson, David. Roberta Ann Hardy, his wife of nearly 50 years, preceded him in death.

Marion and his wife dedicated their lives to each other and their family and both shared a love for all things Christmas. Marion was a kind and gentle person, loving husband and father.

Dedicated to education, he devoted most of his career to teaching high school in Redding, California. Marion was very proud to serve several terms on an elementary school board during his son's school years. He held an undergraduate degree from Chico State University and a master's degree from Sacramento State University.

Marion was an avid swimmer and enjoyed several decades of service to Lions

International. He was involved in the Redding Lions as well as the East Albany Lions and served in officer positions for both. He was very environmentally conscious and always enjoyed talking about politics. His family feels blessed that he chose to move to Oregon several years ago to be near them.

A private celebration of life for family and friends is planned. If desired, memorials may be designated in Marion's honor to the Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation Cardiac Care, Corvallis, Oregon, or to Special Olympics of Oregon.
