



## Marvin Kindred

March 23, 1922 - March 23, 2010

Marvin Andrew Kindred of Corvallis died Tuesday — his 88th birthday — at Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center.

He was born in Yuma, Colo., to Charles Andrew and Ethel Maude Kindred. His family later moved to Iowa before coming to the Pacific Northwest. He moved to Corvallis with his wife, the former Anna Mae Steen, after retiring from the U.S. Navy in 1974.

Marvin was a chief petty officer and served in the Navy for more than 26 years. His service encompassed three wars: World War II, the Korean conflict and the Vietnam War. He was very proud of his country, his time in the Navy, and of his status as a three-war veteran. He was a member of the All 3 Wars Veterans Association.

After retiring, Marvin attended Oregon State University and earned a bachelor's degree. His interests included traveling to other countries, hunting and fishing, and socializing with the coffee clan at Richey's Market.

Marvin was a Mason and a member of the Scottish Rite and the Shriners. He enjoyed people, and they enjoyed him. He will be truly missed.

Marvin was preceded in death by his wife of 52 years, Anna Mae, in 2003; by his brother, Eugene "Spike" Kindred; and sisters Virginia Raymond and Phyllis Babb.

Survivors include his sister, Edna Coulson; and many nieces and nephews.

A funeral with military honors will take place at 2 p.m. Wednesday, March 31, at DeMoss-Durdan Funeral Home. Interment will be at Willamette National

Cemetery in Portland.
