Sharon Patricia Price died Wednesday from complications of her Cerebral Palsy. Sharon was born on Oct. 27, 1947, in Snohomish, Wash.

Sharon was the oldest of four children, born to Will and Jean Price. She is survived by a sister, Susan of Kirkland, Wash.; brothers Mike Price of Hillsboro and Matt Price of Moro; and sisters-in-law Diane Price of Hillsboro and Barbara Price of Moro.

Sharon graduated from Corvallis High School in 1967 and attended Linn-Benton Community College.

Sharon lived on her own for more than 30 years, a major accomplishment in her life-long journey with Cerebral Palsy. She was a go-getter, always seen throughout Corvallis, zipping around on her motorized scooter, proudly flying OSU beaver flags.

Sharon was active in championing for rights of the handicapped. She sponsored several bills in the Oregon Congress, and met with Sen. Mark Hatfield, and Govs. Kitzhaber and Kulongoski.

Sharon was also an author, writing two autobiographical books, "Just Being Sharon," about her challenges in life and her positive attitude in conquering them.

Sharon will be missed as a sister, an aunt to seven nieces and nephews, a great-aunt, a cousin, a friend, and most of all — A Night Owl!
