



Thomas Junior Hash

August 1, 1924 - December 31, 2022

Thomas (Tom) J. Hash passed away on December 31, 2022.

Tom was born in Reed, Oklahoma on August 1, 1924, to Henry Thomas Hash and Lizzie Adelia Hash (both deceased). He grew up in Mangum, OK and graduated from high school there. While attending, he played every sport he could, but he was most known for his time on the football team.

Tom was drafted in the military in 1943. He was sent to New York City to serve in the US Coast Guard during WWII. In 1947, he joined the Army Air Corp and then transferred over to the US Air Force. When he retired in 1964, he was a veteran of World War II, the Korean Conflict, and overseeing our nation's security by maintaining an Atlas missile and site.

Tom's many achievements include two Battle Stars, USAF commendation medal with Oak leaf cluster, the Arctic survival training course certificate, Guided Missile Badge, Jet Aircraft and Crew maintenance and top crew chief in the 98th Bomb Group (just to name a few).

After the military, Tom went on to excel as a salesman. He was a top automobile salesman for 15 years and then a top realtor for Century 21 group. He would completely retire in 1989 to travel and have fun with his wife.

Tom had been a dedicated member of the American Legion Post 51 in Lebanon for over 50 years! Other groups he belonged to include the Elks Lodge, VFW, the 98th Bomb Group, and the 344th Bomb SQ.

Tom is survived by his wife Margaret (Janzen) Hash; daughter Peggy Lewandowski; sons Ronald Hash and Terry Marsh; 5 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.
