“As you can imagine, my strongest memories of Thomas are of a very memorable first grader, who came to school dressed in the manner of things that most interested him at the time! He wore a pea coat and captain's hat for the first part of the school year, but as the year went on, he became interested in Amelia Earhart. Somewhere, his parents found him an old leather aviator's helmet and leather bomber jacket, which he wore constantly. He was sure he could find where Amelia crashed if given the chance! There were other things he wore more briefly, such as a huge sombrero.

Another outstanding characteristic was Thomas' artistic ability. I remember often marveling about how he could take any kind of materials and make something easily recognized, interesting, and attractive. I especially remember things made out of modeling clay, beeswax, and Legos that he would bring from home, but any art activity we did in class could also become something wonderful in his hands. One time he brought (carried by Kayla) a huge piece of plywood with a detailed scene of pirates, ships, and islands made of (I think) Legos. I remember thinking more than once how wise Kayla and Frank were in providing him with materials that stimulated his creativity and imagination (of which he had more than his fair share!).

It was sometimes a challenge in reading group to understand what he was reading aloud, since he read very softly and fast in the distinctive voice he inherited from his dad!

It was a privilege to be able to be a part of the nurturing in his Christian faith! It is plain to see that his family are Christians who live their faith on a daily basis, and who taught their values to Thomas and Chelsea!

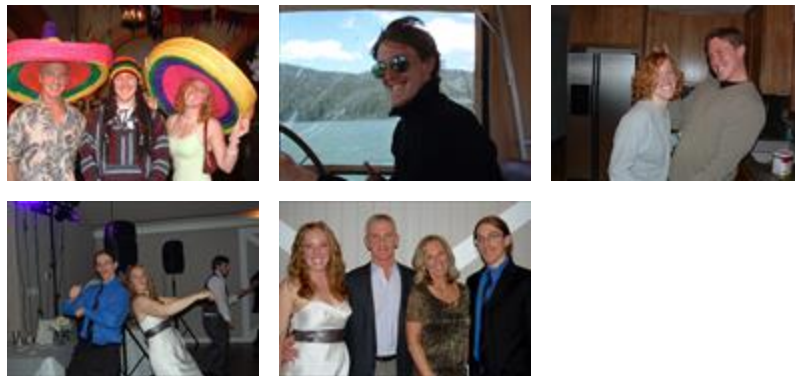
